

Connect the PoE cable to the switch

To connect a PoE cable to a switch, simply plug a standard Ethernet cable from the PoE-enabled port on the switch to the powered device, ensuring compatibility and proper port selection.

Step-by-Step Instructions

1. **Verify PoE Compatibility** Ensure that the switch supports PoE and that the device you are connecting (PD) is PoE-compatible. PoE switches follow IEEE standards such as 802.3af, 802.3at, or 802.3bt, which determine the maximum power delivered per port. Non-PoE devices can be connected safely, but they will not receive power.
2. **Check Power Budget** Confirm that the switch has sufficient power budget to supply all connected devices. Each port consumes a specific wattage, and exceeding the switch's total power budget can cause underpowering or port shutdown.
3. **Select the Correct Port** Use a PoE-enabled port on the switch. Ports are usually labeled or indicated with LEDs showing PoE activity. For example, a green LED may indicate that the port is supplying power to a connected device.
4. **Use the Right Ethernet Cable** Use a standard twisted-pair Ethernet cable (Cat5e, Cat6, or Cat6A). Fiber optic cables cannot transmit power, so only metallic Ethernet cables are suitable for PoE.
5. **Connect the Cable** Plug one end of the Ethernet cable into the PoE port on the switch and the other end into the powered device. The switch will negotiate power delivery automatically through a "power handshake" to ensure the device receives the correct voltage and wattage.
6. **Verify Connection** Check the switch's LEDs or management interface to confirm that the device is receiving both data and power. If the device does not power on, ensure the port supports the required PoE standard and that the cable is properly seated.
