

Distribution Box Spacing Rules



Article Overview

Distribution box spacing standards are governed by NEC, UL, and IEC requirements, specifying minimum clearances between live parts, grounded parts, and working space for safe operation and maintenance.

Spacing Between Live and Grounded Parts

Power distribution blocks (PDBs) and terminal blocks must maintain adequate spacing between uninsulated live parts and grounded parts, as well as between live parts of opposite polarity. The spacing requirements vary depending on the voltage rating, short-circuit current rating (SCCR), and type of overcurrent protection used. For example, at 600V, UL1953-listed PDBs are designed with sufficient spacing for most OEM and field applications, while UL1059-recognized terminal blocks may require evaluation to ensure proper spacing for specific applications .

Working Space and Clearances

The National Electrical Code (NEC) and industry best practices require minimum working space around distribution boxes to allow safe operation, inspection, and maintenance. Typical clearances include:

- Front clearance: Minimum of 3 feet (36 inches) in front of the equipment to allow doors to open at least 90 degrees .
- Side clearance: Minimum of 30 inches from the sides of the equipment, or at least the width of the equipment itself .
- Vertical clearance: Sufficient space above the equipment to access components s...
