

Does the fiber optic cable need to be straightened



Article Overview

Fiber optic cables do not need to be perfectly straightened, but they must be handled carefully to avoid sharp bends, twists, or kinks that can damage the fibers and degrade signal quality.

Handling and Installation Considerations

Fiber optic cables are made of fragile glass or plastic fibers that transmit light signals. While they are stronger than steel when pulled straight, they are highly sensitive to bending and twisting. Sharp bends or kinks can cause micro-bending or macro-bending, which scatters light and increases signal attenuation, potentially leading to data loss or permanent damage to the cable. Cables are typically delivered in coils or on reels. During installation, it is important to uncoil the cable carefully and avoid twisting it. Pulling should be done along the cable's strength members (Kevlar or fiberglass rods) rather than the fiber itself, and the maximum pulling load should never be exceeded.

Bend Radius and Coiling

Fiber optic cables have a minimum bend radius, usually several times the cable diameter, which must be respected both during installation and in long-term applications. Coiling or wrapping the cable is permissible as long as the bend radius is not violated. Exceeding this radius can cause immediate or delayed fiber breakage....
