- 100 Mbps: Suitable for small businesses, basic cloud applications, and VoIP setups.
- 1 Gbps: Ideal for medium-sized businesses, multi-site VPNs, and cloud-heavy workloads.
- 10 Gbps or higher: Designed for large enterprises, data centers, or organizations with high-volume file transfers, video conferencing, and real-time applications. The bearer capacity of a leased line defines the maximum speed the physical line can support, while the circuit speed (CIR) is the configured speed provided to the customer, which can be increased up to the bearer limit without new hardware
