

Fiber stripping length requirements for optical cable splicing



Overview

Strip 3-5 cm of the outer jacket using a cable stripper. Avoid putting tension on the fiber. Bending radius should be >30 mm during handling. Do not. The Contractor tasked to perform testing or splicing on any fiber optic cable will follow these testing standards to fulfill their contractual obligations. Clean the fiber with fiber cleaner or a lint-free wipe and pure alcohol. This Standard may also apply to the Jet Propulsion Laboratory other contractors, grant recipients, or parties to agreements only to the extent specified or referenced in their contracts, grants, a obtain. Through splicing, fiber optic technicians can extend the length of the fiber to make it long enough for use in a required cable run. As fiber optic cables are generally only produced in lengths up to around 5 km, so when lengthier connections are needed, splicing two cables together becomes. Use the proper strip template when stripping for connectorization - All connector types are not designed exactly the same, and will have specific strip-length requirements for Aramid Yarn and Buffers. Most connector will have a "stripping template" available to describe the optimum strip lengths.
