

Ground and neutral wires in the distribution box



Article Overview

It is normal and safe for several neutral wires to be grounded in a distribution box, provided they are properly identified and grouped according to electrical codes.

Purpose of Multiple Grounded Neutrals

In modern North American distribution systems, the neutral conductor serves both as a return path for current and as a safety ground. Grounding the neutral at multiple points along the distribution system—such as at transformers, substations, and service equipment—enhances safety by ensuring that the system can operate safely even if one neutral-to-ground connection is lost . This multi-grounded neutral system reduces the risk of electric shock, stabilizes voltage, and improves fault protection .

Safety and Code Requirements

When multiple neutral conductors from different circuits are present in the same enclosure, the National Electrical Code (NEC) requires that each grounded neutral be identified or grouped to correspond with its associated ungrounded (hot) conductors. This can be done using wire markers, cable ties, or similar means at least in one location within the box . Proper identification prevents confusion during maintenance or troubleshooting and reduces the risk of electric shock when disconnecting or servicing circuits.
