

Hazards of splicing fiber optic cables on bridges

These chemicals can be flammable or toxic. Workers should use them in well-ventilated areas, wear protective clothing, and follow Material Safety Data Sheet (MSDS) guidelines for handling, storage, and disposal . 4. Electrical Hazards Although fiber optic cables carry light rather than electricity, splicing near live electrical equipment or metal bridge structures can pose electrocution risks. Ensuring cables are de-energized and maintaining safe distances from electrical sources is critical . 5. Environmental and Weather Challenges Bridges are exposed to wind, rain, and temperature extremes. High winds can destabilize ladders or scaffolding, while cold temperatures make ca...
