An optical fiber is a slender, flexible strand made of glass or plastic that transmits light signals over long distances using the principle of total internal reflection. It consists of a core, where light travels, surrounded by a cladding with a lower refractive index to keep the light confined, and often a buffer coating for basic protection against minor physical damage . Optical fibers can be single-mode, supporting one light path for long-distance, high-quality transmission, or multi-mode, supporting multiple paths for shorter distances . Fibers are extremely thin, fragile, and cannot be used directly in most environments without additional protection.

An optical cable is a structured assembly that contains one or more optical fibers along with protective layers such as buffer tubes, strength members, and an outer sheath. These layers protect the delicate fibers from moisture, temperature changes, physical stress, and environmental hazards, making them suitable for indoor, outdoor, or underground installations . Optical cables can be designed in various forms, including loose-tube cables for outdoor flexibility, tight-buffered cables for indoor use, and ribbon cables for high-density installations .
