

How far apart are the cable trays

The recommended minimum distance between parallel cable trays is 0.6 meters (approximately 24 inches) to ensure adequate maintenance access and reduce the risk of electromagnetic interference (EMI).

Horizontal Spacing

- **Minimum Distance:** When installing two cable trays in parallel at the same height, the distance between them should be no less than 0.6 meters. This spacing is crucial for maintenance access, inspection, and proper airflow for heat dissipation .
- **Power and Signal Cables:** For power and signal cable trays, a minimum horizontal spacing of 0.5 meters is recommended to minimize EMI, especially where they might cross electrical facilities. If the trays are shielded, this spacing may be reduced to less than 0.3 meters .

Vertical Spacing

- **Minimum Vertical Distance:** The minimum vertical spacing between floor-mounted cable trays should be 150 millimeters (approximately 6 inches). This clearance prevents obstruction and ensures structural integrity, making it easier to install additional trays and cables in the future .
