

How to connect the secondary distribution box to the main line



Article Overview

A secondary distribution box (subpanel) is connected to the main panel using a dedicated feeder breaker, two hot wires, a neutral wire, and a ground wire, with strict separation of neutral and ground for safety.

Step 1: Safety and Preparation

Before any work, turn off the main service disconnect to de-energize the system and use a voltage tester to confirm zero voltage on the main panel bus bars and lugs . Implement a lockout/tagout procedure to prevent accidental re-energization. Ensure you have the proper permits and comply with local electrical codes, including NEC requirements for panel spacing and working clearance .

Step 2: Determine Subpanel Location and Load

Select a location for the subpanel that meets NEC Article 110 clearance requirements. Calculate the anticipated electrical load by summing the wattage or amperage of all devices and applying a 125% factor for continuous loads . Choose a subpanel with a main lug or bus bar rating that matches or exceeds the feeder breaker amperage.

Step 3: Install Feeder Breaker and Wires

Install a two-pole breaker in the main panel sized for the subpanel load (commonly...
