The connector end plugs into equipment, patch panels, or ODF ports, while the bare end is permanently spliced to the incoming fiber cable. Pigtails are preferred over patch cords for terminating bulk fiber runs because they provide factory-quality connectors and allow precise field splicing (). Pigtails come in various types:

- Connector types: LC, SC, ST, FC, MT-RJ, E2000
- Fiber types: Single-mode (yellow jacket) and multimode (orange or aqua jacket)
- Fiber counts: Single, 6, 12, or more strands ().

- Fusion splicer: Melts fiber ends together for a continuous optical path
- Fiber strippers: Remove the outer coating without damaging the glass...
