

Installing the bottom light of the cable tray



Article Overview

Bottom-mounted lights on a cable tray should be securely attached using proper supports, maintaining clearance, and following NEC guidelines for safety and accessibility.

Planning and Preparation

Before installation, plan the tray route and lighting layout. Ensure the tray type (ladder, solid-bottom, or ventilated trough) can support the additional weight of the lights and that the tray is properly mounted with supports spaced according to load requirements, typically 1.5 to 3 meters apart depending on tray type and load . Establish elevation benchmarks using a laser level or transit to maintain consistent height along the tray run .

Mounting the Lights

- Attachment Method: Use brackets, clamps, or hangers designed for the tray type. Avoid using the tray itself as a lifting or attachment point for heavy loads .
- Clearance: Maintain at least 12 inches of vertical clearance above the tray for cable access and maintenance, as recommended by NEC 392 .
- Weight Considerations: Ensure the combined weight of cables and lights does not exceed the tray's maximum load capacity (typically 318–340 kg per hanger), .
- Alignment: Position lights evenly along the tray to provide uniform illumination and prevent stress on the tray structure
