The most commonly used optical cables in public networks are single-mode fiber (SMF) and multi-mode fiber (MMF), with plastic optical fiber (POF) used for short-distance consumer applications.

Types of Publicly Used Optical Cables

1. Single-Mode Fiber (SMF)

- Designed for long-distance communication with minimal signal loss.
- Features a small core size ($\sim 9 \mu\text{m}$) and typically uses laser light sources.
- Common wavelengths: 1310 nm or 1550 nm.
- Widely deployed in telecommunications, undersea cables, and backbone networks due to its high bandwidth and long-range capabilities .

2. Multi-Mode Fiber (MMF)

- Designed for shorter distances and higher data rates within local networks.
- Larger core size ($50 \mu\text{m}$ or $62.5 \mu\text{m}$) and uses LED light sources.
- Common wavelengths: 850 nm or 1300 nm.
- Frequently used in data centers, enterprise LANs, and campus networks where high-speed transmission over moderate distances is required .

3. Plastic Optical Fiber (POF)

- Made from plastic instead of glass.
- Suitable for consumer electronics, automotive networks, and short-distance indoor applications.
- Offers flexibility and ease of installation but is limited in distance and bandwidth compared to glass fibers
