

Standard Requirements for Temporary Distribution Box Connection



Overview

Learn what OSHA requires for temporary wiring on construction sites, from grounding and GFCI protection to overhead clearances and employer liability. Work requires electrical power for many purposes. However, exposure to weather, frequent relocation, rough use and other conditions not normally encountered with conventional wiring systems necessitate special consideration not required in other applications or in completed structures. These federal rules, enforced by Article 590, address the practicality and execution issues that are inherent in temporary installations, thereby making them less time consuming to install and less time consuming to remove. The provisions of this paragraph do not apply to conductors which form an integral part of equipment such as motors, controllers, motor control centers and like equipment. 1926.405

Except as specifically modified in paragraph (a) (2) of this section, all other requirements of this subpart for permanent wiring shall apply to temporary wiring installations.

Temporary electrical wiring for construction sites

All 120-volt, single-phase, 15- and 20-ampere receptacles shall be of the grounding type and their contacts shall be grounded by connection to the equipment grounding conductor of the circuit ...

The requirements of Article 590 apply to temporary power and lighting installations and removals, including power for construction, remodeling, maintenance, repair, demolition, and decorative lighting.
