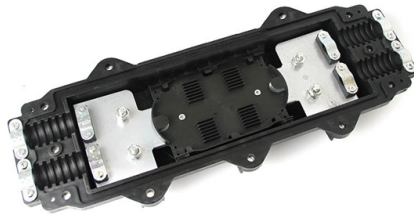


Steps for splicing drop fiber optic cable and pigtail

The connector end plugs into equipment, patch panels, or optical distribution frames (ODFs), while the bare end is designed to be permanently spliced to an incoming fiber cable. Pigtails are commonly used in single-mode and multi-mode applications and come in various connector types such as SC, LC, ST, or FC. Unlike patch cords, which have connectors on both ends, pigtails allow for precise factory-quality terminations combined with flexible field splicing.

Using pigtails moves the critical connector polishing and termination to a controlled factory environment, ensuring low insertion loss, high return loss, and reliable performance.
