

Tail fiber removal



Article Overview

Removing a tail fiber requires careful stripping, cutting, and handling to avoid damage to the fiber and ensure safe termination.

Safety First

Always wear personal protective equipment including safety glasses and gloves, as fiber shards can cause injury. Work in a clean, well-lit area and safely dispose of any fiber scraps immediately to prevent accidents or contamination of the workspace .

Step-by-Step Procedure

- Prepare the Cable
- Remove the outer jacket using a jacket stripper rated for the cable diameter. Position the stripper 40–50 mm from the end and pull steadily toward the tip without rotating aggressively to avoid scoring the buffer tubes .
- Cut any aramid (Kevlar) strength members flush with scissors to prevent interference with the fiber .
- Strip the Fiber Coating
- Use a dedicated buffer tube stripper to remove the 250 μm or 900 μm coating from the bare glass fiber. Position the stripper at the distance specified by the connector manufacturer (typically 25–30 mm from the fiber tip) and pull in a single smooth motion .
- Avoid jerky or repeated motions, as micro-cracks can form in the glass, compromising the fiber's integrity
