FC Connector Overview

The FC (Ferrule Connector) is a fiber optic connector designed for high-precision and high-stability connections, particularly in single-mode and polarization-maintaining fibers . It features a cylindrical ferrule, typically made of zirconia ceramic or stainless steel, which holds the fiber core in precise alignment. The ferrule is inserted into a threaded metal barrel and secured with a screw-on coupling nut, which prevents rotation and ensures a firm connection .

Extending FC Fiber Optic Cables

To extend FC fiber optic cables, the FC connectors on each cable are mated using an FC adapter. The adapter has a threaded interface that matches the screw-on design of the FC connectors, allowing two cables to be joined end-to-end while maintaining low insertion loss and minimal back-reflection . The threaded design is particularly advantageous in environments with vibration or mechanical stress, as it prevents accidental disconnection .
