Overview of Optical Modules

An optical module, also known as an optical transceiver, is a device that converts electrical signals from network equipment into optical signals for transmission over fiber optic cables, and vice versa . It operates at the physical layer of the OSI model and typically consists of a laser diode or LED transmitter, a photodiode receiver, driver and receiver circuits, and an optical interface . The module enables high-speed data communication between devices such as routers, switches, and end-user equipment.

Common Types at the User End

- SFP (Small Form-factor Pluggable): Supports data rates up to 4.25 Gbps and is widely used in enterprise networks for short to medium distances .
- SFP+ (Enhanced SFP): Supports up to 10 Gbps, suitable for high-speed connections in data centers and advanced enterprise networks .
- Other types (less common at the user end): QSFP and CFP modules are typically used for higher-speed backbone or data center links rather than individual user connections
