Ensure that the certification documents are site-specific and that the enclosure type (Ex d, Ex e, Ex p, etc.) matches the environmental risk . **Installation Practices:** Proper installation is critical. Key requirements include:

- Sealed conduits and cable glands to prevent gas or dust ingress .
- Correct mounting on stable surfaces to avoid vibration or mechanical stress.
- Thermal management to prevent heat buildup, which could ignite flammable atmospheres .
- Avoid any modifications (drilling, cutting) that could void certification . Environme...
